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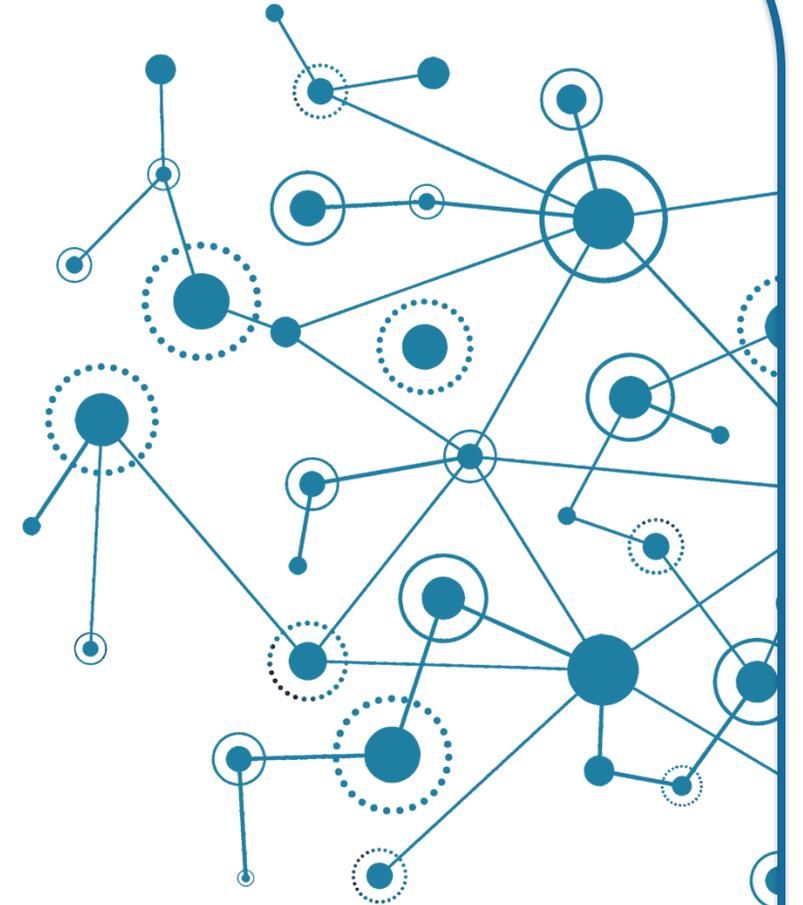

Understanding DLP Capabilities



- Functions they perform:
 - Scan for sensitive data
 - Enforce basic data movement rules
 - Integrate with mail gateways/endpoints/networks

- What they don't do:
 - Understand context/intent
 - Stop disguised/encrypted exfiltration
 - Adapt to new risks

Common Data Exfiltration Gaps

- Where DLP tools are deployed
- Shadow IT vs. sanctioned IT
- Access to cloud systems
- Computer peripherals
- Other blind spots
- Screenshots/photos (let's be reasonable)



Filling the Gaps in DLP

- Awareness & training
- Content filtering
- Auditing access controls and enforcement
- Tracking your data – User Behavioral Analytics



Identifying Locations of Sensitive Data

- Working with Business Leaders
- Understanding Privacy Laws
- Review Data Duplication
- 3rd Party Services



Data Tagging & Labeling

- Tag by value/sensitivity
- Consistent labels
- Automate with AI/ML (only after manual tagging)
- Integrate with access/sharing policies



Final Thoughts

- There are no magic bullets
- DLP is not just a product, it is a complete program
- Train/test/evolve your process
- People/process/governance are critical
